Regular Festival goers will be surprised that this year's Birmingham, Sandwell and Westside Jazz Festival runs for 17 days, not 10, with the weeknights of the extra week from July 26th containing far fewer events than usual. A word of explanation: originally the Festival was to run from July 16th to 25th, with the expectation that freedom from COVID restrictions would operate from June 21st. When that date was moved to July 19th, several venues expressed a preference for postponing events to the weekend of July 30th-August 1st. Hence the lop-sided programme - and an extra week of jazz!

Back for its 37th year, the Birmingham, Sandwell & Westside Jazz Festival is one of the undoubted highlights of the West Midlands cultural calendar.

The festival, which has provided the soundtrack to our summers since the 1980s, is a celebration of live music. And let's face it, we've all missed the shared pleasure of live performances over the last 16 months.

With almost 130 performances, this year's event offers a timely boost to our visitor economy and previous festivals have attracted audiences of over 75,000, generating almost £5 million for the regional economy.



That success is thanks to the brilliant efforts of the festival organisers and the amazing support of sponsors.

Many of us look forward to this festival every year and I'm sure we won't be disappointed as the 2021 Birmingham, Sandwell & Westside Jazz Festival proves once again that there's nothing guite like top class live music.







In telling the story of almost 80 years of Oxford Street's legendary club Digby draws on the memories of such departed notables as George Melly, Lennie Hastings, Campbell Burnap and Jim Godbolt as well as many of the current stars of the British jazz scene: Art Themen, Alan Barnes, Bruce Adams and the rest. Digby will have plenty of stories of his own to tell at book signings during the Festival.

# **ABI K & THE SWING PIGS**

Abi K is a professional singer, songwriter, bandleader, and vocal coach with a passion for jazz, blues and soul.

Abi's most recent single *Just Say Yes*, was released on 20th April 2020 (available on numerous music platforms), followed by the EP *Let's Begin*. This release demonstrates music and vocals with more grit and sensuality than her previous jazz and blues-influenced self-titled EP, released in 2016.

# **ALAN BARNES**

No Birmingham Jazz Festival would be complete without the outstanding clarinettist/ saxophonist/composer/ arranger Alan Barnes. His career since leaving Humphrey Lyttelton's Band has taken in playing with many of the top American jazzmen, collecting over 30 British Jazz Awards in at least five categories and being twice nominated as BBC Jazz Musician of the vear. One of the highlights of 2020's small-scale Birmingham Festival was his quintet set with Alex Clarke streamed from West Bromwich Central Library.

#### **ALEX CLARKE**

As a finalist in the BBC Young Jazz Musician of the Year 2020, and winner of the Rising Star category in the 2019 British Jazz Awards, Alex Clarke is known to be one of the most in-demand and versatile young reeds players emerging on the British iazz scene. Praised for her extensive repertoire list and intelligent ear for harmony, she brings a youthful, intuitive approach which sounds authentic in a variety of musical settings from New Orleans to bebop. Alex's deep respect for the heritage of the music can be heard in a swinging, melodic approach reminiscent of Scott Hamilton and Lester Young, with strong influences of Phil Woods and Cannonball Adderley.

#### **ART THEMEN**

During the lockdown Art has kept busy, with two recordings, one with Dave Green. Dave Barry and Gareth Williams, the other with Pete Whitaker and George Double -Thane and the Villeins. This resulted in two BBC radio broadcasts and a flurry of gigs for the trio starting last summer which were stopped short by COVID. As well as taking part in Ronnie Scott's anniversary celebrations Art played a single gig in Norway with Soft Machine before the latest lockdown

# THE BACKYARD MUSIC BOYS

Led by Matt Palmer, the Backyard Music Boys are a four-piece acoustic band lining up with clarinet, trumpet, sousaphone and banjo and guaranteed to provide the excitement and verve of 1920s and 1930s hot jazz.

#### **BIG BOSS MAN**

This mandolin/guitar duo features two of the area's most highly regarded blues players: Richard Heath from Festival favourites The Whiskey Brothers and Stuart Johnson, once of Tea and Symphony.

Fronted by Big Jim Merris of the Red Lemons Blues Band, the Alabama Boogie Boys have become audience favourites at Henry's Blueshouse, both at the Bulls Head and in the Botanical Gardens. Their mix of blues, boogie and rock and roll is a guaranteed crowd-pleaser.

# BIRMINGHAM URBAN SKETCHERS

This light-hearted Facebook group is made up of 602 members who just like to capture all things Birmingham and the Jazz Festival is a perfect event for us. All sketches are done from life, not photographs, and Sketchcrawls are organised where a number of people come together to record a visit or event. Individuals also happily sketch and send in their work to share.

We love to sketch anything: music gigs ,chickens, trains, buildings, cranes and just life going on in Birmingham.

# **BILLY THOMPSON TRIO**

Billy Thompson is a classically trained improvising violinist from North Wales who works in a wide variety of styles. He achieved the rare distinction of reaching the televised stages of the BBC Young Jazz Musician of the Year in both 1996 and 1998. He worked regularly with Barbara Thompson's Paraphernalia (no fewer than five albums) and also played with such big names as Mike Westbrook, Jools Holland and Huw Warren. Endlessly versatile, in recent years he has worked most often with his gypsy jazz group.

## BOPERATOR BOOGIE BAND

Originally a 40s jump jive and 50s rhythm and blues outfit called Boperator, the band revamped itself in 2013, with a more colourful line-up and repertoire. Now a seven-piece aiming to please anyone with a soft spot for hard boogie, the Boperator Boogie Band covers tunes from an eclectic mix of artists. Ray Charles, Louis Jordan and Prima, Asleep at the Wheel, Caro Emerald and many more.

#### **BROOKS WILLIAMS**

Born in Statesboro, Georgia, and now domiciled in Cambridge, England, Brooks Williams was playing Americana even before it was called that. With 30-plus recordings and 30-plus years touring, Brooks has been recognised as one of the Top 100 Acoustic Guitarists. He

makes a more than welcome return to the Birmingham Festival shortly before the September release of his latest album, Ghost Owl, duos with fiddler Aaron Catlow.

## **BRUCE ADAMS**

A ferocious player with impeccable technique, Bruce can also display a surprising lyricism and melodic gift. A regular at Birmingham, he has featured on several live recordings from the festival, with the likes of Django's Castle and the great Kenny Baker. Most recently, Bruce has been working with Craig Milverton on a project celebrating the great cornet and piano players. After delays caused by the coronavirus pandemic, the album should be complete in August.

#### THE CATFISH KINGS

The Catfish Kings serve up a mix of rock'n'roll, boogie and rhythm and blues, with Chuck Berry, Little Richard and Jerry Lee Lewis at the centre of their set, with some jump jive, New Orleans rhythm and blues and swing to help keep the party moving. Patrons of Henry's Botanical Blueshouse will already have had the chance to hear the Catfish Kings in one of the band's first post-lockdown gigs.

# **CERI JUSTICE AND THE JURY**

Ceri Justice is a singersongwriter from Solihull who began writing poetry and songs as a teenager. In the 1990s she entered a nationwide singer/songwriter competition and beat

many thousands to win a place in the semi-finals, but was denied a coveted place in the grand final.

Ceri came back with a debut album called Justified, now available on most media platforms and she also began performing locally with her band. Ceri Justice & The Jury, a mixture of Americana and blues with a hint of country. Her second album, as yet untitled, is due out in July of this year.

#### **CHASE JAZZMEN**

Based in the Shropshire area, the Chase Jazzmen are made up of talented musicians experienced in the field of popular traditional jazz. Regulars at the Trumpet, Bilston, and much in demand for

# STREAMING FROM SANDWELL

The support of Sandwell Council in recent years has been crucial, with the many events in the borough's libraries and museums a particular joy. In the truncated 2020 Festival Sandwell's libraries, though not open to the public, hosted two outstanding concerts by the Alan Barnes/Alex Clarke Quintet and the Bruce Adams Quartet which were available on stream in Birmingham venues as well as on Youtube where both concerts are still available.

So successful was the experiment that four performances will be streamed from Sandwell libraries this year: with a live audience from Wednesbury Library (Wednesday 21st) and West Bromwich Central Library (Saturday 24th), streamed without an audience from Blackheath Library (Friday 16th) and Thimblemill Library (Friday 23rd). The Friday performances feature American guitar wizard Brooks Williams (16th) and Festival favourite, song stylist Roy Forbes (23rd). Audiences are allowed in at Wednesbury for twice BBC Young Jazz Musician finalist Billy Thompson with his trio and at the Central Library for another fine gypsy jazz group, La Bouche Manouche.

#### **CHICKENBONE JOHN** AND HARMONICA DAVE/ **TONY STOKES**

Chickenbone John, 'The Godfather of the Cigar Box Guitar', has become a huge favourite at the festival in recent years, with highly successful workshop/ concerts demonstrating how to make and play 3-string cigar box guitars. In performance he is joined by his regular associate, Harmonica Dave or, on some gigs, Tony Stokes of the Red Lion Blues Band and the Crossroads Blues Club, in reviving the authentic sounds of early blues.

#### **CHRIS BOWDEN**

Having first made a mark with K-Creative in the acid jazz boom of the early 1990s, saxist Chris Bowden went on to record the highly original Time Capsule in 1996, featuring his arrangements for 12-piece band. As a performer. Chris also has a highly individual style and he is equally at home in a variety of genres: acoustic jazz, hip hop, drum and bass.

# **DAVID MOORE BLUES BAND**

Leading an exciting blues band that is one of the

great favourites at Henry's Blueshouse, David Moore graduated from the Birmingham Conservatoire in 1999. In 2010 he moved to New York where he worked in a number of styles of music. Now back in Birmingham, he takes a fresh and original approach to blues, rock and soul.

## **DEBORAH ROSE/ MARTIN RILEY**

Welsh-born singer/ songwriter/guitarist Deborah Rose straddles jazz, folk and Americana, with more than a touch of Celtic influence. Her voice, frequently praised for its purity and emotional quality, was described by folk legend Judy Collins as "one of the finest I've heard." Back in 2013, her debut album. Song Be My Soul, featured orchestrations by classical composer/pianist Martin Riley, an association that has continued in their immediately post-lockdown concerts.

#### **DIGBY FAIRWEATHER**

Digby Fairweather has been a great influence for good on the British jazz scene, not just for his distinctively melodic trumpet style. Currently his main preoccupation is the Jazz Centre UK which

he has established in Southend, with an impressive display of memorabilia, a comprehensive archive and an ever-growing programme of events. Digby also has a fine track record as jazz writer, broadcaster, archivist and bandleader - his Half Dozen has been one of the most popular of British small groups for many years.

## **EAGLE JAZZ BAND**

The Eagle Jazz Band is one of the great names in Birmingham jazz, with a history stretching back to 1951. Now led by reedman Matt Palmer, the band operated under the name The Millennium Eagle Jazz Band for some time, but has now restored the muchloved traditional name. With a recent CD out. Memories. the band mainly homes in on classic jazz material and the songs of the 1920s to 1940s, but, with many multi-instrumentalists in the band, their sound and approach are flexible.

#### **EMMA JONSON**

Emma is a rapidly up and coming, award winning blues pianist from the Midlands having already supported some of the

UK's top acts including Jamie Cullum, Heather Small and Roy Wood and recently was personally invited to join Walter Trout onstage at Birmingham Town Hall. Each week until lockdown forced its closure Henry's Blueshouse operated under the slogan Tuesdays is Bluesdays! During the pared-down 2020 Festival Henry's made its mark with special events comprising blues films. record sessions and talks. In addition The Bulls Head screened live streamings of concerts and operated as the Festival Information Point.

Now the good news is that Henry's Blueshouse returns in its original live form every Tuesday from June 20th and the re-launch is celebrated with Henry's Bluesday at the Festival. The following Tuesday Stuart Maxwell and the other members of The Shufflepack present seven hours of history, blues talk and great music from 1500.

# **WESTSIDE BID**

Westside BID. centred on Broad Street, has been a crucial element in the Festival's success in recent years, both in generous financial support and the number of bars, pubs and restaurants giving their whole-hearted participation. Such is the extent of Westside's participation that their name was added to the Festival title two years ago. As always a stroll down Broad Street in the afternoon or evening is accompanied by the sound of jazz and blues, with events, in many cases more than one, at the Brasshouse, the Bull's Head, O'Neills, the Velvet Music Rooms, the Cosy Club, Lee Longlands, the Hilton Garden Inn and Central Square, Brindleyplace.

In demand as teacher and session musician, Lucy is the daughter of the late Julian Piper, a legendary figure in the South West and beyond Lucy herself has played at such major festivals as the Juke Joint Festival in Clarksdale, Mississippi, the Notodden Blues Festival in Norway and the Freiburg Blues Festival in Germany.

## MARTIN LITTON AND JANICE DAY

Martin Litton is a brilliant and versatile pianist with a remarkable sense of historical context in jazz. The names of two of his groups, his Gramercy Five and his Red Hot Peppers, show his delight in the great jazz of the past and he is an acknowledged expert of ragtime and stride. First making an impact with Kenny Ball's Band in the 1980s, he is now in demand for festivals and all-star groups in the UK and internationally.

His wife and musical partner, Janice Day, specialises in authentic performances of the finest songs of the interwar years, commemorating a great age of female singers. Together they have presented stage shows such as *Dance Band Divas* and *Fats Waller in Love*.

# **MAXWELL & WHITE**

#### THE NITECRAWLERS

Stalwarts of Henry's Blueshouse and regulars at such blues festivals as Upton-on-Severn and Newcastle-under-Lyme, the Nitecrawlers aim to recreate the sheer enjoyment of the original R&B clubs of the 60s. The Old Jelly Rollers are a musical collective whose

Spats Langham, singer, quitarist, banjo player, all-round entertainer and repository of old songs both lewd and lovely, is joined by multi-instrumentalists Danny Blyth and Malcolm Sked in Hot Fingers. Neatly described as 'vintage acoustic string music', Hot Fingers' brand of musical entertainment is ageless, if hardly new. Generally one of the busiest live groups around, Hot Fingers have pretty much taken an unwelcome sabbatical in the last year, but in recent years have worked on a show describing the origin and history of acoustic blues and a project called The Banned Plays On.

# STRICTLY JITTERBUG

Hopefully the easing of social distancing will allow the Festival to resume its always popular audience participation events, including the highly successful dance classes by Strictly Jitterbug. Strictly Jitterbug have been teaching a mixture of East Coast Swing and Charleston for over 10 years, including two years as a resident dance teachers at Birmingham's Waterworks Jazz Club, and were much missed in 2020's more limited festival.

### STUART MAXWELL: HARMONICA WORKSHOP

Stuart Maxwell, as well as leading the blues band the Shufflepack, is an authority on all things blues. He writes widely on the subject and his book, *Starting Blues Harmonica*, has been widely re-printed, with an accompanying CD. Stuart's workshop should be unmissable for the aspiring blues harmonica player.

#### **SUZI WOODS**

Suzi Woods' repertoire is an engaging mix of American Songbook greats and modern classics. Her sophisticated style has brought her music to an international audience, with shows for Valentino in Rome and Princess Grace of Monaco in Monte Carlo.

# **SWING CAFÉ**

Led by popular Midlands singer Billie Baker, Swing Café is a swing and jazz band playing the best loved songs of an era from the 1920s to the 1950s. Fine melodies mix with a sound that keeps on the sunny side of life!

In the last year Billie and the band have kept themselves busy by writing and rehearsing new material which they look forward showcasing alongside all the traditional familiar standards that we love to play.

#### **TIPITINA**

Tipitina's unique take on the blues, barrelhouse, boogie and gospel of New Orleans owes much to the music of Professor Longhair, Dr. John, James Booker, Fats Domino and Allen Toussaint. and still more to the powerful vocals of Debbie Jones and Justine Randall's mastery of New Orleans piano. With two acclaimed Big Bear CDs behind them, Tipitina regularly excite and charm audiences at the Birmingham Festival where they recorded a live album in 2011.

#### THE WHISKEY BROTHERS

Fast becoming festival favourites at Birmingham, Big Bear recording artists the Whiskey Brothers are Richard Heath on vocals and mandolin and Gerry Smith on piano. 
